It is ideal for local clubs and special interest groups such as the Art Group and the Ladies Group. It is suitable for indoor recreation – there is currently pilates, indoor bowls and gentle yoga. We can also cater for small business use, whether that be training, presentations, conferences or client entertaining. We offer a large hall, a small room, a fully equipped modern kitchen, and wifi, projector and screen, and disabled access. We currently only charge £8 an hour, the cheapest rate in the area.
