The farm is on North End on the left, half way between West End and Laytham Road (Breckstreet Lane). Just drive into the yard (or walk!) there is plenty of room to park. Ann Murr sells vegetables, eggs and locally produced honey, from the outbuilding on your right as you go into the farm yard. If the door isn't open please walk on to the back door of the farmhouse and ring the bell. Basics – potatoes carrots onions greens are always available plus a selection of seasonal goodies new in each Thursday afternoon, ready for the weekend. There are no specific opening times – there is normally someone around to serve you at any time, however there are always people working in the outbuilding, in the mornings up to about 11.00 am. Also Seaton Ross teatowels are on sale here – ideal gifts for those who have everything (except a dishwasher!)
