
Seaton Ross Parish Council

THE PEOPLE'S PANTRY: a new service for people of Market Weighton and Pocklington who are struggling to look after themselves and their families in today's harsh economic climate has been officially opened

The People's Pantry is open to everyone who needs help to support themselves or their families. It is a not for profit enterprise run by volunteers and is a member of FareShare, a charity aimed at relieving food poverty and reducing food waste in the UK, with the membership being sponsored by The Pocklington District Lions Club

In exchange for a small membership fee people are given points which they can then spend on anything available that week in the pantry, saving them money on food and other essentials. Please bring proof of benefit and your own bags. Location: All Saints' Church, Market Weighton. Opening times: Tuesdays 10.30 am -12.30 pm, Fridays 4-6pm.

The produce for the pantry is provided by FareShare with the majority of it being donated by local people.

We are offering a collection point here, at the back of Seaton Ross church. Just drop anything off you want to (but no perishables thank you) and we will make sure it gets to Market Weighton straight away.
