It's been a difficult year and our open spaces have never proven as important or been more valued. However, due to Covid restrictions, the SRPF association has had no opportunity to raise funds over the past 16 months and we find ourselves in the position where we need to ask for help. Over the coming year we need to raise around £1,000 for general maintenance and insurance costs and a further £1,000 to cover the costs of replacing some rotten fencing that poses a potential hazard.

We have already made an application for a community grant and will be applying for a parish council grant. We hope to hold a couple of events in the near future to help raise some of the funding, but with so many unknowns we also need to ask if anyone is able to make a donation. KCOM 19 x faster full fibre broadband could come to Seaton Ross

In the March edition we mentioned that Phil Cutland Green was working to encourage KCOM to provide fibre broadband to Melbourne and surrounding villages. The good news is that this has now been approved and infrastructure will start to be laid in July. Seaton Ross could be next to receive full fibre broadband with speeds of up to 1 Gbps. All that is needed is for at least 30% of the village residents (business and consumers) to pre-register with no commitment at this stage. That will then allow KCOM to develop the business case as the first part of the process. KCOM are a registered supplier of the government's [Gigabit Broadband Voucher Scheme](#) which is used to supplement build costs with no connection costs for residents who take up the scheme. KCOM also offers grants to support local causes and Community Projects. The first step is to go to <https://www.kcomhome.com/campaigns/get-real-fibre/> to register that initial interest on KCOM's portal. Further updates will be provided on progress on bringing Full Fibre to Seaton Ross..
