### Local Goods & Services

- **Lumley's Village Shop:** Open daily for groceries, local press and fuel.
- **The Farm Shop:** A range of vegetables, fruit, eggs and locally produced honey are usually available from the shop which is on North End (on the left, half way between West End and Breckstreet Lane). Open daily, there is normally someone around to serve at any time (please ring the bell at the back door of the farm house). There is also a barrow by the roadside.
- **Cluny's Pop-Up Shop:** Lamb from Cluny's local herd of Shetland Sheep, wool and crafts are sold in Mill Lane. Look out for the blue board advertising Saturday openings or details on Facebook.
- **The Black Horse:** Please refer to the blackboard outside the pub on South End or phone 319386 for opening times and to make any bookings.
- **Hunts Eggs:** Free range eggs are available from the roadside stall on South End. Payment by cash or enquire at Rose Farm Bungalow if you would prefer to pay by BACS.
- **Mark Blackburn Motor Engineers:** The garage is situated on North End, between The Old Mustard Mill and West View. It is fully equipped to deal with servicing, general repairs, tyres and MOT tests for any make or model as well as offering other services including car and van hire. Opening hours are 8.30am-5.30pm, Monday-Friday. Please call 318171 for further information.
